

LUISAVIAROMA AND THE ITALIAN CULTURAL INSTITUTE OF NEW YORK CELEBRATE DANTE WITH AN EXIBITION AND READING BY JOHN TURTURRO.

On the occasion of the 750th anniversary of his birth, LUISAVIAROMA pays homage to Dante Alighieri by contributing to an exhibition in his honor. The first of its kind to be held in the United States, the exhibition will feature an extraordinary portrait of the poet, painted by Agnolo Bronzino in the mid-16th century.

Bronzino's painting will be on display at the Italian Cultural Institute of New York from 15 December 2015 until 15 January 2016, five years after the MET devoted a solo exhibition to the celebrated Renaissance artist.

On 16 December, actor John Turturro will read an excerpt from Dante's Inferno, in both Italian and English. The reading of the Divine Comedy in different languages will be entrusted to the students of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York (daily, from 6pm to 12am).

It was not until recently that the "Allegorical Portrait of Dante" was confirmed to be the work of Agnolo Bronzino. The work belongs to a private collection and has only ever been exhibited to the public in Florence.

In the portrait the poet holds in his hands the Cantos XXV (the 25th Sphere depicted in Heaven), which he used to express his longing to end his exile and return to his beloved Florence.
